Call to Order and Announce a Quorum is Present

With a quorum present, the regular meeting of the Bee Cave City Council was called to order by Mayor Murphy at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 8, 2014 in the Council Chambers of the City of Bee Cave City Hall, 4000 Galleria Parkway, Bee Cave, Texas.

Citizen Comments

Joe Jarrett, 13411 Overland Pass, stated that the traffic turning off Highway 71 West into the Homestead was hazardous. He asked the Council to make changes to the striping.

City Manager Frank Salvato reported that the Staff had contacted TxDot regarding the restriping. It should be complete by the end of the week.

Sheila Leech, 5202 High Canyon Pass, also spoke on the hazardous turn lane into the Homestead.

Carrell Killebrew, 5410 Great Divide, commented that TxDot should not have restriped the lane without the input from the local government. He stated that the City is following protocol but putting the citizens at risk.

Dean Appling, 13105 Roundtop Circle, also commented on the traffic and restriping. He stated that he does not want this to happen again. He suggested that the City get a paint bucket and fix the problem.

Mr. Salvato commented that it is a State Highway and the City does not have the authority to paint the highway.

Terri Mitchell, 5400 Great Divide, also commented on the restriping of Highway 71 West and the dangerous turn lane onto Great Divide.

Rick Scadden, 5400 Great Divide, also commented on the traffic turn lane onto Great Divide. He cautioned the Council about dealing with developers who may not have the City's best interest.

Karen Phillips, Homestead, commented that the distance of the turn lane was not enough for turning onto Great Divide. She stated that a traffic accident was going to happen.

Mr. Killebrew commented that the Council is here to protect the citizens. He suggested that the Staff paint over the stripe and deal with the fall-out with TxDot later.

<u>Presentation and discussion on the rate increase for the Texas Municipal Retirement System</u> <u>for the year 2015.</u>

Anthony Mills, TMRS Regional Manager and Leslee Hardy, TMRS Actuarial Services Director, discussed the contribution rate and the changes associated with the rate calculation.

Heather Page, Director of the Texas Film Commission/Office of the Governor, spoke to the Council regarding the film industry. She fielded numerous questions from the Council regarding incentive funding, market fluctuations and economic viability.

Jack McCool, 3504 Avendale, commented that he was against the Council spending money for a feasibility study. He stated that he believed that the Milam projects will be feasible if it is managed properly and the Council needs to make a significant effort to see who is going to run the projects.

Mr. Killebrew commented that he likes the project but there needs to be a commitment from someone that will move in. He also suggested that the Council prepare a map to determine where all the film studios are located.

Discuss and consider action on Ordinance No. 201, amending Ordinance 12-113, Planned Development-Retail (PD-R), for Hill Country Indoor, located on Lot 1, Block A, HCI Subdivision, City of Bee Cave, Texas, as recorded in document number 201300022 of the official public records of Travis County, Texas, consisting of 8.60 acres generally north of Highway 71, west of Highway 620, and south of Bee Cave Parkway, adjacent to the Backyard property, to amend the Concept Plan (Exhibit "B") for location of buildings, site improvements, and building elevations, and to amend the Planned Development Standards (Exhibit "C").
