<u>Discussion regarding the West Travis County Public Utility Agency including an update from their legislative consultant.</u>

Pix Howell, consultant, and Don Rauschuber, General Manager of the PUA, reviewed the history of the PUA and updated the Council on the possible drafting and filing of legislation for the 2015 Texas Session to make the Agency more efficient. They are hoping to go through a legislative list with the members of the PUA to clarify, under the existing PUA statue, and make sure everyone is on the same page as they move forward.

No action was taken on this item.

<u>Discuss and consider action regarding an easement request for Texas Gas Service for location of a regulator station and gas utility lines on City property.</u>

City Engineer Giancarlo Patino presented this item. Texas Gas Service proposes the extension of 3,320 feet of 10-inch steel high pressure gas main along Bee Cave Parkway and a pressure regulator station at the corner of Bee Cave Parkway and RR 620.

Nancy Stence, Manager Regional Engineering for Texas Gas Service, stated that they would like feedback on the proposed or alternative sites for the location of a Regulator Station prior to moving forward with formal engineering plans and legal documentation.

Adrian Overstreet, Managing Partner of the Sonesta Hotel, stated that he wanted to utilize a gas line for the hotel. He suggested that one of the sites would be more feasible for him to access.

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MOTION: A motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Goodwin, seconded by Council Member Bliss, to authorize Area 3 (west side of RR 620 and South of Bee Cave Parkway,) for the regulator station and gas utility line easement location for Texas Gas Service and to authorize the City Staff to negotiate and bring back an easement for approval by the City Council.

<u>Discuss and consider action regarding the acceptance of public improvements in the Ladera</u> subdivision - Phase IIIB.

Stephen Dorman with Sledge Engineering presented this item. The dog park is almost complete but we are still waiting for the grass to grow before opening the park. The hike and bike trail

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had some washout during the last significant rain event. A change order may be considered at a future meeting.

Scott Morledge made a presentation to Council regarding a connectivity plan.

Terry Mitchell, 5400 Great Divide, commented that she supported the trail connectivity and wanted to thank the people who were working on the ideas.

Steve Albert, 5308 Great Divide, spoke about relying on standards from planners for trails and bicycle lanes.

Staff will work on a request for proposal for the hike and bike trail connectivity plan.
